**States as basic subjects of the international law
and their correlation with the theory of sovereignty (conceptual approach of German lawyers) //

The author in the suggested article does the research about the evolution of scientific approaches of German lawyers to states as basic subjects of the international law and their vision of sovereignty.

The scientific work includes three blocks of problems.

The first part is devoted to the classification of subjects of the international law, as it is offered by the German concept: main, derivative, independent groups and other (traditional and contended).

The second part offers the complete picture states in the German scientific school. The main criteria of differentiation of states in the XIX century were: religious (F. List), geographical (A. de Vattel, J.G.G. Justy), geopolitical (F. Tsorn, M. Zadel, etc.), «negative» (A. Merkel), cultural (R. Mool), criterion of power (A.V. Gefer, M. Zadel, R. Iering, A. Merckell, F. Tsorn, etc.), including their forms of power.

The third part analyses general approaches to the theory of sovereignty. Analyzing state, as the main subject of the international law from the position of «the theory of three elements», German scientists analyze the correlation of the scientific term «territorial sovereignty» forms of its restriction.

The scientific work by Antonov I.P. fills in the loopholes for Russian-language readers and makes an interest for those, interested in problems of the international law.
